# September 18 (Thursday), 6:30 p.m. St. Luke Lutheran Church Annual Plants-for-Members (P4M) Sale

September and October are great months for planting new rhododenrons and azaleas! With Fall 2008 in mind, last fall the P4M Committee collected approx. 500 cuttings of choice plants and had them rooted for the membership by Van Veen Nursery. Assuming typical yield levels, we should have approx. 300 newly rooted plants to distribute to our members at the September meeting. Prices have not yet been determined, but the goal is to make them available at our cost, which should mean approx. \$4 or \$5 per rhodie, and perhaps half that for azaleas.

# October 16 (Thursday), 7:30 p.m. Flowers on the Frontier—The Bartram Family Plant Collectors and Naturalists in 18<sup>th</sup> Century North America

John Bartram and his son William were unique in 18<sup>th</sup> century America, homegrown natural scientists and practical gardeners. Ultimately, from 1728 to 1850, four generations of Bartrams lived and worked at the family farmstead from 1728-1850, and made their livelihood by the exchange of plants and natural history specimens with the world. Bartram Gardens became a gathering point for scientists, artists, gardeners, and the curious.

This talk will trace the careers of John Bartram and his son William, their travels in North America, and their impact on international science. It will also look specifically at some of the Rhododendron species that the Bartram family discovered and introduced to gardens in North America and Europe.

#### In Memoriam

We lost a kind and loyal friend when Francis 'Fran' Raughley, Jr. died on July 5, 2008 at the age of 86. Fran joined the Valley Forge chapter in 1977 and remained an active member until his death.

A life-long resident of Delaware, he was a project engineer at DuPont until he retired in 1985. He spent his retirement years pursuing his passion for gardening, attending the Barnes Foundation Arboretum School, volunteering as a garden guide at Winterthur, and being an active member not only of several ARS chapters but also of the Day Lily and Holly societies. In 1986, he received the ARS Bronze Medal after serving as Valley Forge Chapter Librarian and Director for many years and as Chapter President from 1984-1986. In 2002, Fran was honored by the University of Delaware's Goodstay Gardens for his work on its Horticultural Advisory and Education Committees. He was proud of his beautiful garden and shared it with others on numerous occasions. Fran also will be gratefully remembered for procuring for us at almost every meeting a fine selection of gardening books that satisfied every need and interest.
