NEXT EVENT: District 8 Cutting Exchange and Plant Auction. Sunday, Aug. 19, at the Chadds Ford home of Debby Schmidt. Proceeds benefit the ARS Endowment Fund and the ARS Research Foundation. The event begins at 1:30, when those contributing cuttings should arrive (details on cuttings below). The sale of cuttings (Cheap, my friends, cheap!) starts at 2 p.m. At 2:30, there will be an auction of donated plants (yes, you may donate plants for the auction). Karel Bernady will be the auctioneer. A propagation demonstration follows the auction, and dessert is scheduled for 3:30.

Please bring chairs, desserts and (optional) cuttings. Beverages will be provided. (Feel free to bring your own lunch as well.)

Cuttings: Take cuttings early in the day after watering or rain the evening before. Cuttings taken lower on a plant are preferred (they seem to root better), and should be about 6 inches of this year's growth. Place 6 cuttings of the same variety in a zipper-style plastic bag with just a few drops of water. Critical: label the bag in indelible marker with the variety and your name. Given the likely weather, refrigeration is recommended, even putting the bags in an ice chest (though not directly atop ice) for the trip to Chadds Ford.

Directions: 51 Blue Stone Drive, Chadds Ford, Pa. Debby Schmidt's home is just north of Route 1, between Longwood Gardens and the Chadds Ford business district. Turn north on Chandler Road, proceed about a half-mile to Fox Run Road and turn right. At the end of Fox Run, turn left and proceed to No. 51, which is on the left.

PLANTS FOR MEMBERS, WITH A TWIST. This annual meeting/sale, which has been known to have members virtually panting with expectation, returns to an arboretum near you on Sunday, Sept. 9. As in the past, rooted cuttings, adorable in their little pots, will be sold at a remarkably low price. Even more remarkable is the opportunity to acquire choice, delectable, obscure varieties. If anything could top that, our propagation maestro, Karel Bernady, has mastered the ancient art of grafting. Thus, the impossible-to-root are now acquirable. The grafted plants to be sold are two years old and, given the extra effort and time they required, will cost more. A list of all rooted and grafted cuttings to be sold will be posted on our website in late August, and an *email* reminder of the meeting will be sent then as well. (If you do not receive email, mark your calendar now; if you cannot wait until the sale/meeting itself to get a printed list of varieties, contact Karel Bernady in late August.) The sale takes place Sunday, Sept. 9, at the Bloomfield Farm section of Morris Arboretum. We'll gather at 1:30 p.m. for conviviality and refreshments, with chapter announcements preceding Karel's warm-up spiel and the sale itself.

A FUN B.Y.O. DAY IN THE SHADE. Thursday, Aug. 23. That's Bring Your Own Lunch, and help Karel Bernady stick cuttings for next year's crop of baby rooted plants of incomparable rareness and desirability. Those who have never propagated cuttings are particularly encouraged to take part – you'll learn best techniques (Karel's rooting success is storied) and there's always plenty of rhododendron tidbits in the conversation around the work table. The workday starts at 9 a.m. (late arrival is fine) and takes place, rain or shine, at Steve Kristoph's nursery in the middle of New Jersey (a quick few miles from Exit 8 of the New Jersey Turnpike).
